

Dual Credit/College Course-Testing Requirements

Students, who request to participate in any of the dual enrollment college classes listed below, must meet one of the testing requirements indicated. See chart below for specific details.

EOC results will be verified by the counseling office once results are received, however, if students need to qualify through TSI, SAT or ACT, students will be responsible to bring results in to their designated counselor.

If students do not qualify through EOC or if other results are not received by the end of the year, the course(s) will be removed from the students' request. Adding a course back in to a student's request will be based on availability.
