### Course Outline/Topics

Biology is the study of life. Topics covered in this course include: biomolecules, cells and cell cycle, genetics, evolution, ecology, taxonomy & classification, plants, animals, and human biology. Course work, lab work and examinations will prepare students for EOC state exams as well as future courses. The student must have pencils or pens, a composition notebook, and a positive attitude. Instructional days will include checking/reviewing assignments, quizzes, writing assignments, lecture/explanation, lab activities and individual practice/questions/feedback.

<b>Unit 1</b> Biochemistry	Scientific method, Biomolecules, Enzymes, Dehydration Synthesis, Hydrolysis
<b>Unit 2</b> Cells	Cell theory, Prokaryotic cells, Eukaryotic cells, Animal and plant cell organelles
<b>Unit 3</b> Cellular Transport	Plasma membrane, Passive transport, Active transport, Tonicity, Homeostasis
<b>Unit 4</b> Cellular Energy	Cellular energy, Photosynthesis, Cellular respiration, Aerobic and anaerobic respiration
<b>Unit 5</b> Cell Division	Cell cycle, Cancer, Mitosis, Meiosis
<b>Unit 6</b> Genetics	Genetics, Punnett Squares, Monohybrid Cross, Dihybrid Cross, Non-Mendelian Genetics, Pedigree, Karyotype
<b>Unit 7</b> DNA	DNA Structure, DNA Replication
<b>Unit 8</b> Protein Synthesis	Transcription, Translation, Mutations
<b>Unit 9</b> Evolution	Evidence of common ancestry, Convergent & Divergent Evolution, Adaptations, Natural Selection, Evolutionary Mechanisms
<b>Unit 10</b> Taxonomy	Classification, Cladograms, Phylogenetic tree, Dichotomous key, Kingdoms
<b>Unit 11</b> Viruses	Viral Structures, Viral cycles, Viruses vs Bacteria
<b>Unit 12</b> Body Systems	Human body systems, System interactions, Immunology
<b>Unit 13</b> Ecology	Plant systems and types, Plant adaptations and hormones, Ecology, Food chains, Food Webs, Energy pyramids, Ecological relationships, Biogeochemical cycles

- There will be an exam (test for a major grade) for each unit.
- 1st Semester exam will be at the end of Semester 1 and will be over Units 1-6
- 2nd Semester exam will be at the end of Semester 2 and will be over Units 7-13
- STAAR BIOLOGY EOC TEST will be in May and will cover ALL of the units taught throughout the class.
