Named after the visionary land developer John H. School

Sharyland Pioneer High School, a comprehensive four-year public high school, opened its doors in the fall of 2014 and quickly became a cornerstone of its community. With an enrollment of 1,418 students in grades 9-12 in 2022, it is deeply ingrained in the educational landscape. The school takes pride in its diverse student body, with 93.5% of the population identifying as Hispanic and 4.7% as White. As a member of the College Board, Sharyland Pioneer High School places a strong emphasis on academic excellence, preparing its students for future success. It proudly graduated its first class in 2015, marking the beginning of a legacy of achievement.

Curriculum

The academic program at our institution is designed to provide students with a rigorous and accelerated learning experience, around a block structured system. Over the schedule course of the academic year, students earn nine credits through a combination of eight 90-minute block classes and one 45-minute period. Each semester, students enroll in four block classes. We offer a diverse range of Advanced Placement (AP), Dual Enrollment, and Honors classes, catering to the diverse academic interests of our students.



Grading & Ranking

Class rank is determined by calculating the average of all core course semester grades from the beginning of each academic year through its conclusion. In the case of senior class rank, the calculation includes the average of core course semester grades up to the third semester, the final progress report grade for a 50-minute period, and the grades earned in government/economics dual enrollment or Advanced Placement (AP) government/economics courses. This ranking system assigns grade points exclusively to academic core courses in English, science, mathematics, and social studies, spanning grades 9 through 12.
